Author of numerous studies and articles on Lacanian and Freudian psychoanalysis, on the psychoanalytic clinic of children and adolescents, he published in various volumes and journals in French, English and Romanian.

Călin CIOBOTARI is a theatre critic, professor, and doctoral supervisor at the Faculty of Theatre of the "George Enescu" National University of Arts Iași. He is an associate professor at the Faculty of Philosophy and Social Political Sciences at the "Alexandru Ioan Cuza" University of Iași. Member of the International Association of Theatre Critics, of the Romanian Theatre Union and of the Romanian Writers' Union, he is the author of over twenty books and about thousand articles (journalism, studies, theatre chronicles etc.).
